CHAPTER ACTIVITIES FOR 2022:

<u>Thursday, January 13, 2022</u> – *Native Plants for El Paso* presented by Dr. John White, Retired Botanical Curator at the Chihuahuan Desert Garden, UTEP

<u>Thursday, February 10, 2022</u> – *Peaking into the Virtual and In-Person Herbarium of the UTEP Biodiversity Collections* presented by Dr. Vicky Zhuang, Biodiversity Collections Manager at UTEP. Dr. Vicky Zhuang coordinates the care and use of an estimated 600,000 preserved specimens of fossils, plants, and animals.

<u>Thursday, March 10, 2022</u>– *Landscaping with Chihuahuan Desert Plants presented by Mr. Michael Eason,* botanist, native landscape designer, and prolific photographer. Mr. Eason heads the Rare Plant and Conservation Department at San Antonio Botanical Garden based in Alpine, TX. He is currently working on a few book projects - "Wildflowers and other Plants of the Chihuahuan Desert - A field guide", "The Fabaceae of Texas", and "Naturalized and Invasive Plants of Texas". <u>Thursday, April 14, 2022</u> – *Preview of FloraFest at UTEP* <u>presented by Dr. Kevin Floyd,</u> Botanical Curator of the Chihuahuan Desert Gardens at UTEP.

<u>Thursday, May 12, 2022 – Carbon Dynamics in Drylands:</u> <u>Ecosystem Productivity Now and in a Drier Future presented by</u> Dr. Marguerite Maurtiz-Tozer. Dr. Marguerite Maurtiz-Tozer is a Research Assistant Professor with the Systems Ecology Lab at UTEP. She is interested in ecosystem function and how ecosystems respond to climate change and other pressures. She also tries to understand how changes in temperature, rainfall, and plant species composition affect carbon dynamics and what that means for the future.

Thursday, June 9, 2022 – *National Pollinator Week 2022* presented by Dr. Paul Hyder. Dr. Hyder is an environmental educator currently teaching at Eastwood High School. He has an M.S. and Ph.D. from New Mexico State University where he studied rattlesnake ecology, and creosote bush phytochemistry. Dr. Hyder is the current president of the El Paso Cactus and Rock Club and teaches for the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department's Master Naturalist Program.

<u>Thursday, July 14, 2022</u> – Below the Surface: The Extraordinary Lives of Lichens, Fungi, and Other Microorganisms in the Chihuahuan Desert presented by Ms. Cat Cort, desert ecologist and educator. Ms. Cat Cort is currently working on her PHD in Ecology and Evolutionary Biology at UTEP.
