The 23-image exhibit with educational captions was installed at the Santa Fe Botanical Garden on April 26, 2023 and will remain up until November 26, 2023. The SFBG estimates an average of 22,000 visitors during that time.

Activities conducted along with this exhibit have included:

- April 26: I have an exhibit tour to SFBG docents and volunteers providing information and stories for them to conduct tours of the exhibit
- April 27: Public talk and slideshow at SFBG about the exhibit and environmental art
- April 28: Short presentation about exhibit to audience at SFBG Museum Café brunch
- Additional 90 minute Exhibit tours for public given in June, August, & September.
- April 29: Exhibit opening event and fundraiser for SFBG. I gave a public talk and SFBG docents conducted tours, over 150 people attended the event.
- I created a website www.pinoncountry.com and digital version of the exhibit that links through QR codes posted in the exhibit for this project.
- 7. How does your project further a Native Plant Society mission area, namely: plant or ecological education; conservation/restoration of native plants and/or their habitats; adds to botanical research; promotes appropriate use of native plants to conserve water, land and/or wildlife.

The exhibit images tell the story of the natural history of the Pinyon Jay, their important relationship with piñon trees, the threats to their survival and their habitat, and what viewers can do to help the Pinyon Jay and piñon trees thrive. In addition to raising awareness about the plight of the Pinyon Jay and piñon-juniper woodland to the Santa Fe Botanical Garden's

nearly 22, 000 visitors between April - November, the exhibit provided visitors information on how to participate in Audubon's community science project to collect data on Pinyon Jays, and piñon masts and help scientists build a more complete picture of the woodlands to direct their conservation efforts. The exhibit also directed viewers to the project website (www.pinoncountry.com) where they could learn more and connect to volunteer opportunities to help Pinyon Jays.

I think the exhibit was an excellent way to educate and engage a general audience in this issue. I received many comments from visitors and those who atteded an exhibit tour with me that they learned a lot from the exhibit and intend to stay connect to the issue.
