Through the Carter Grant, the Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc. Omega Alpha Zeta Chapter partnered with the US Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) and the Sevilleta Long Term-Ecological Monitoring Research station to coordinate a landmark event focused on environmental stewardship, inclusivity, career exposure, and reclaiming Black relationships with nature. This full day program occurred on June 9, 2023. This initiative was to counter historical exclusions and emphasize cultural engagement with the natural world. By leveraging partnerships and receiving funding, we were able to remove financial barriers for attendees by offering a free excursion with binoculars provided, nourishment, and exposure to wildlife plus exclusive scientific experiments that are closed to the public.

7. How does your project further a Native Plant Society mission area, namely: plant or ecological education; conservation/restoration of native plants and/or their habitats; adds to botanical research; promotes appropriate use of native plants to conserve water, land and/or wildlife.

At Zeta Day at the Sevilleta National Wildlife Refuge, attendees visited long-term scientific experiments that are not open to the public, saw an unprecedented amount of wildlife and flora including Oryx, pronghorn antelope, and western kingbirds, as well as did a hands-on activity to collect plants to be housed in the Sevilleta herbarium. The Sevilleta National Wildlife Refuge is one of the few places in the country that also has long-term experiments on the refuge. Through visiting experiments that are long-term, attendees gained valuable insights on the magnitude of experiments necessary to understand how our environment will respond to climate change. We selected experiments that sported drastic visible differences in their plant communities to be explained by our tour guide so attendees could see the effect of the treatments without looking at measurement data. In addition to the immediate impact this event had on participants, the herbarium hands on activity allowed these individuals to be recorded in history as their collection will be housed permanently. Through our partnership with Helena Mieras, the Sevilleta Herbarium's 700+ plant collection was annotated and digitized to be made publicity available. She designed a curriculum, which was implemented for the first time at our event, and will be used in perpetuity. Each attendee received a booklet highlighting the workflow that the attendees applied to produce their own herbarium plant collection.

Our attendees were able to engage with an all femme presenting panel of USFWS leadership that was dominated by people of color. The panel specifically showcased the intentionality of Zeta's national partnership with the USFWS to reclaim outdoor spaces and provide career pipeline to institute systemic change. It was especially enjoyed by our participants because of the rarity of seeing women, non-binary, and people of color in positions of leadership in the USFWS. This was no accident. We specifically asked women, LGBTQIA+, and Black USFWS and SEV LTER guides to participate.
