A special session of the 10<sup>th</sup> Natural History of the Gila Symposium (Feb. 28-Mar.1 2024) featured the work of 4 photographers, each of whom made 20 min. (15 min. + 5 min. Q&A) presentation, in the form of a story, on a subject of their choosing. The presentations took place in the Miller Library at Western New Mexico University. The session included an exhibit of 5 photos from each photographer that were posted in the WNMU Miller Library in the same area as the presentations. Furthermore, several of the photos from the participating photographers were printed as posters.

7. How does your project further a Native Plant Society mission area, namely: plant or ecological education; conservation/restoration of native plants and/or their habitats; adds to botanical research; promotes appropriate use of native plants to conserve water, land and/or wildlife.

This project celebrated the contribution of photographers to the study of natural history. It promoted attendance at the 10<sup>th</sup> Gila Symposium by providing colorful photographs with a wider appeal than just scientific and natural resource management presentations. It also encouraged student participation in the symposium by providing posters, which students love to put in their rooms either at home or in a dormitory. Students are the future and their participation and/or attendance in symposium each have the potential to inspire them to pursue natural history related careers.
