3. Greenhouse - native plant and book sales

Taos Chapter continues to collaborate with the Taos Land Trust, sharing our greenhouse in Rio Fernando Park and the space surrounding it. Under the direction of Kathryn Mayer, year-round, volunteers (avg. 10) gathered weekly on Wednesday mornings to grow and maintain plants and the demonstration garden, to improve greenhouse structure and hardening off room, and prepare for multiple plant sales. New greenhouse door was built and installed after second break-in.

May 25 – Plant and book sales at greenhouse (\$2,500 plants, \$500 books)

June 12, 19, 26 – Casual plant sales at greenhouse, 10 a.m. to 12 p.m. October 2 - Plant clearance sale, with proceeds going to benefit Paul Bryan Jones, a Taos arborist and member of Taos Chapter, with his medical expenses.

Continued involvement with TCCWMA Working Group: Chapter member, Bob Pokorney participated in monthly meetings of the working group for the Taos County Cooperative Weed Management Area [TCCWMA] and assumed the chairmanship position for Working Group in 2022. This group was established in 2018 to promote awareness of and develop actions to thwart the proliferation of noxious and invasive species in the county. [Other participants include Town of Taos, Carson National Forest, NMDOT, NM Dept of Agriculture, Taos Soil and Water Conservation District (TSWCD), Southern Methodist University/Taos, Rocky Mountain Youth Corps, Amigos Bravos, Taos Land Trust, BLM, USFS, and private citizen/educators.
